

VERNON FISH & GAME CLUB

ORIENTATION

1. The Vernon Fish & Game Club range facility is located at 202 Bardolph Lake Forest Service Road.
To access Bardolph Lake FSR:
 - Take Hwy 6 from Vernon to the East side of Lavington
 - Turn North on Noble Canyon Road
 - Proceed 3.1km, then take the fork on the right
 - Proceed 1.1km to the range entrance on the left side (just past the 4km marker)
 - *see map on the last page of the Range Regulations
2. Please note that the road to the range is a forest service road which is not regularly maintained. Please be prepared for unfavorable driving conditions. The club endeavors to plow the road to the range in winter months; however access is not guaranteed. 4x4 is recommended. Please contact info@vernonfishandgame.ca for updates on range access conditions.
3. The main entrance gate must be locked at all times. It is your responsibility to ensure that the gate is locked immediately behind you when entering or exiting the range. Do not grant access to any other individuals unless the individual can provide proof of current membership (membership card or key with current year stamp).
4. The range facilities include the following (see diagram on last page of the Range Regulations):
 - Reserve Handgun Range (first range on the right)
 - This range is for third party groups to rent (such as RCMP); rental applications must be approved by the club
 - If not rented, this range is available to club members to use
 - Handgun Range B (second range on the right)
 - Archery butts and 3D bag course (on the left, across from Handgun Range B)
 - Handgun Range A (third range on the right, at the top of the hill)
 - Rifle Range (on the left, across from Handgun Range A at the top of the hill)
 - Backstops at 50m, 100m, 150m, 200m, 300m and 400m
 - The key for the main gate will unlock the doors of the rifle range
5. Ranges may be reserved for events or discipline training. There is a sign at the main gate entrance which will indicate if ranges are in use (reserved) or open for members use.
6. Vernon Fish & Game Club Range Regulations detail which firearms are permitted to be used at each range facility. All Range Regulations must be adhered to at all times. All members are responsible to know, understand and comply with the Range Regulations.

7. Members are responsible for their own actions, the actions of their family and guests at all times when on Vernon Fish & Game Club facilities. Any failure to comply with the Range Regulations, or any other rules and regulations of the Club, may result in loss of range privileges or loss of membership.
8. Each of the handgun and rifle ranges has a flag outside of the building. The flag must be raised anytime the range is in use. If the flag is raised when you arrive at the range, assume the range is in use and follow the Range Regulations. The flag must be lowered and placed in the box on the flag pole when the last shooter leaves the range.
9. Each of the ranges has a sign-in book. All members and guests are required to sign in immediately when they arrive at the range. Sign-in and sign-out are required at each range, if you are using more than one of the range facilities.
10. There are range control flags at each of the firearms ranges; the range control flags must be used whenever members are using the range. The green flag indicates that the firing line is safe. The red flag indicates that the firing line is active. Refer to the Range Regulations for detailed procedures regarding flag use.
11. In the event that there is more than one shooter at any one of the range facilities, one person must be deemed to be the range officer. The designated range officer is responsible for ensuring that the red and green flags are placed in accordance with the Range Regulations, and that all shooters follow the firing line procedures. Refer to the Range Regulations for common range commands to be used by the range officer.
12. When using the rifle range, remove targets when finished shooting. Ensure all of the doors are closed and locked before leaving.
13. When using the handgun ranges, remove targets and move the target stands to the side of the range when finished shooting.
14. The warm-up room is attached to the rifle range. The key for the main gate will unlock the warm-up room and it is available for all members to use. There is a wood stove; firewood is not regularly supplied (bring your own). Ensure that the door is locked behind you when you leave.
15. There is not any reliable cell service at the range. Some people are able to get cell service when standing at the 400m backstop on the rifle range. In the event of an emergency, you will get regular cell service at the entrance to Noble Canyon Road at Hwy 6. There is a fire extinguisher and first aid kit located in the warm-up room. Please ensure that you inform the club if these supplies are used so that they can be re-stocked.
